501(c)(3) non-profit made up entirely of volunteers


Rooted in a grass roots effort begun in 1997 to work on an update of the original 285 Corridor Plan that had been adopted in 1987.




Trails Team


- The 2006 Survey identified that "Trails" are a high priority for our community.








